

## COVID-19 Exposure

Wednesday, June 24, 2020

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Yesterday, June 23, 2020, management was notified by a resident who used the fitness center at Tuscany Falls on June 9, 11 and 14, and at Eagle's Nest on June 17, that they have tested positive for COVID-19. In addition, we received two other positive COVID-19 notifications today from other homeowners, not related to fitness center usage. For reasons of privacy and confidentiality in CDC guidance, we are not sharing the residents' names or additional health information.

The residents who notified the HOA were under no obligation to do so, but chose to out of courtesy and to be of service to others. We are reaching out to you today in that same manner, as a courtesy to inform you. We are aware that not everyone who tests positive will be so forthcoming. With that in mind, we encourage you to remain committed to following CDC and other government guidelines about handwashing, mandated social distance and mandated mask usage. These actions will help slow and stop the spread of the virus, and protect your own health. If you believe you have been exposed, or were in close contact with someone who has been exposed, seek the advice of a medical professional as soon as possible.

The HOA continues to follow the latest CDC recommendations for cleaning and disinfecting. HOA staff members in housekeeping sanitize at regular intervals throughout the day in all of our open/occupied facilities, and staff members within the various HOA operations regularly clean and sanitize equipment and other areas, as applies to the location. Hand sanitizer stations are available throughout HOA indoor facilities and fitness centers are also equipped with sanitizing gym wipes for individuals to use immediately upon finishing an

exercise.

In addition to efforts the HOA is making, everyone has a personal responsibility to do whatever possible to slow and stop the spread of COVID-19. While currently-operating amenities remain open at this time, residents who continue to use fitness centers, pools, sports courts, golf courses, etc., do so at their own risk. While there is no need to panic, the virus is here in PebbleCreek, so please follow all guidelines to help this community stay as safe and healthy as possible.
