

COVID-19 Vaccination scheduling for Phase 1B-eligible begins Jan. 11

Friday, January 8, 2021

Please review the following information taken from Maricopa County and provided by Banner Health; it outlines who is considered Phase 1B and how to go about requesting an appointment, providing proof of eligibility, etc. Information on where vaccine will be distributed and how to access scheduling systems will be posted on the county webpage beginning on Monday, Jan. 11. For your convenience, some of the details from that page are shared directly below for you.

Who Can Be Vaccinated in Phase 1B (Priority)

Eligible populations in Phase 1B-prioritized are:

- K-12 school staff and childcare workers
- Law Enforcement/Protective Services*
- Adults age 75 and older

*This includes all sworn officers and government-employed security officers.

On Monday, Jan. 11, Maricopa County will open up vaccination scheduling at Point of Dispensing (POD) sites (to be shared on the county webpage) for Phase 1B-prioritized individuals.

- People in Phase 1B must have an appointment to get vaccinated. No walk-ins will be allowed.
- Information on where vaccine will be distributed and how to access scheduling systems will be posted on [this page](#) beginning on Monday, Jan. 11. There is no sign-up process available prior to Jan. 11.

- Appointments will be limited initially for Phase 1B and will be available at POD sites that are not already fully-booked for second doses to prioritized individuals from Phase 1A.
- People in both Phase 1A and Phase 1B will be able to register and search for any available appointments that are not already filled by prioritized healthcare personnel.

At your appointment, be prepared to show:

1. Your appointment confirmation
2. A form of ID confirming your Phase 1B employment, such as a work ID or paystub or an ID that shows your age if you are 75+.

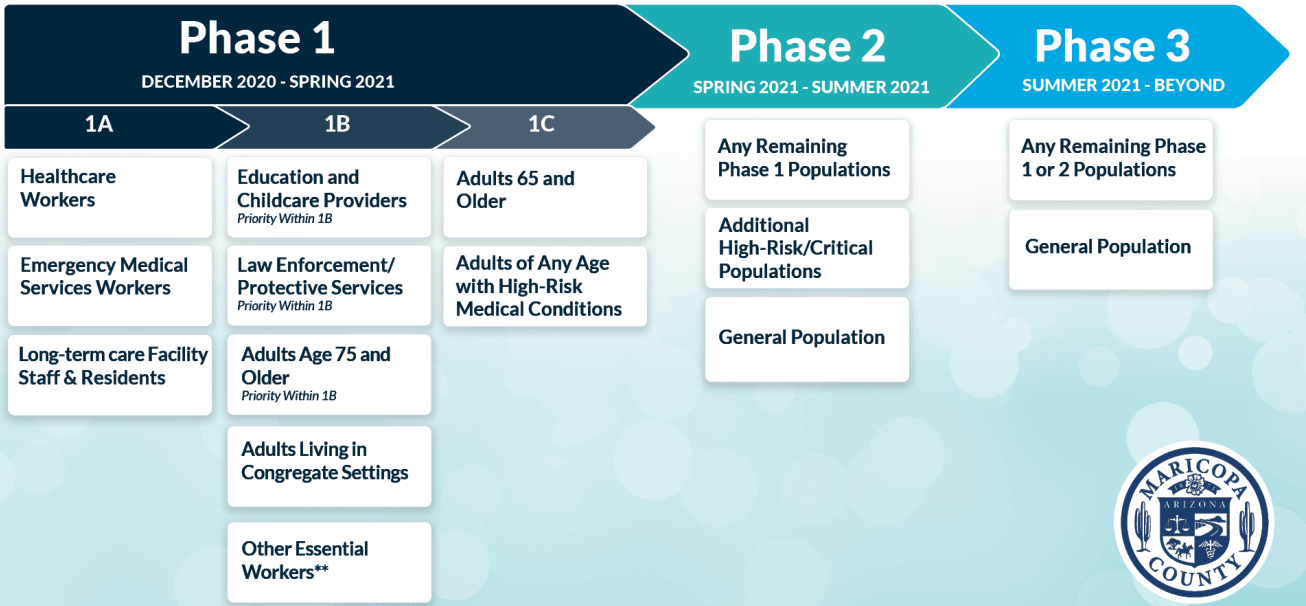
