

Dog Park renovation to begin April 28

While the COVID-19 virus has caused life to change in ways we did not anticipate, and that have been difficult, the HOA has been trying to utilize this time in a productive way. We have committed to take on and complete planned projects and improvements now, while the various facilities and buildings are not being used.

One of the areas that needs improvement is the PebbleCreek dog park. Over the last few years, with use and age, the dog park has deteriorated. Trees have become overgrown, the grass areas are sparse and uneven, and the granite barrier around the fence line needs replacement. With this in mind, we have now planned a much-needed renovation to improve all of these areas. The project includes the removal of several trees, re-grading and smoothing of the surface, replacement of all turf with new Bermuda grass, and replacement of granite along the fence line. We are also going to add water stations for the dogs outside of both entrances to the dog park.

The project will begin on Monday, April 28, to re-grade, re-granite, and prepare the area for new sod. Sodding will begin on May 5. Once the sod is placed, we will need three to four weeks to establish the new turf. Once the new turf is established, the dog park would then be ready to reopen, provided government guidelines related to COVID-19 permit it at that time. Our goal is to be able to open during the first part of June. The reason we weren't able to begin this renovation sooner has to do with Bermuda grass turf not being available until now. We are excited to complete this project, and the once the dog park reopens, it should feel brand new, and sure to have tails wagging!
